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
















FLORENCE NIGHTINGALE

- 1860Nightingale Training School for Nursesopens at St Thomas' Hospital





- 1994 EuSEM founded
- 1998 First European Congress on EM
- 2001 First Mediterranean EM Congress
- 2005 UEMS Committee on EM created
- 2005 First Meeting of Presidents of European Societies



EuSEM

The European Society of Emergency Medicine was founded as a forum for physicians who work within a structure providing pre-, inter- and/or in-hospital emergency medical care



Emergency Medicine is a specialty based on the knowledge, skills & competencies for the prevention, assessment & management of acute & urgent aspects of illness & injury affecting patients of all age groups with a full spectrum of undifferentiated physical & behavioural disorders

Emergency Medicine further encompasses an understanding of the development of pre-hospital & in-hospital emergency medical systems & the skills necessary to participate in this development.

- Seeks to establish similar standards of training in EM throughout Europe
- Has recommended Principles of Training and a Core Curriculum

- Promote international collaboration in EM




European Journal of Emergency Medicine

- Papers on all aspects of acute illness and injury



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Emergency Medicine in Europe

- Formal recognition of specialties determined by EU Directive 93/16, now 2001/19/EC
- EM included in Directives from 1993
- Until 2004, Directives recognised EM as specialty only in UK and Ireland
- Since 2004, EM recognised as primary specialty also in Czech Republic, Hungary, Malta, Poland & Slovenia

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Union Européenne des Médecins Spécialistes (UEMS)

- Statutory purpose of U.E.M.S. is the harmonisation and improvement of medical specialist practice in the European Union
- Key element is education and U.E.M.S. is seeking to formulate a common policy in the field of training

Multidisciplinary Joint Committee on EM

- First meeting in Brussels 28 April 2005
- Sections of Anaesthesia, Internal Medicine,
 Geriatric Medicine, Allergy..... and EuSEM
- Sections of Surgery, Paediatrics and Neurology also invited
- Working towards harmonisation of Teaching, Training and Practice of EM
- Reviewing EM Curriculum and Competencies



Principles of Training in Europe (Recommendations of EuSEM)

- 5 year programme of specialist training
- Minimum of 3 years in Emergency Department
- Training Departments and Trainers to be accredited by a National Training Authority
- Annual Assessment of Trainees
- Final Formal Evaluation (format to be agreed)



EM Core Curriculum for Europe

- Core Competencies
 e.g. Clinical Practice Communication Teaching Management
 Research Pre-Hospital Care
- Problem-oriented Knowledge Base
