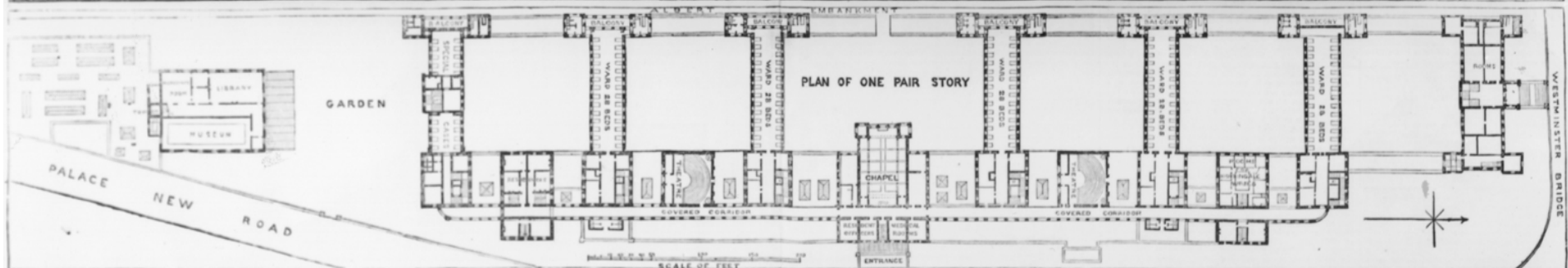

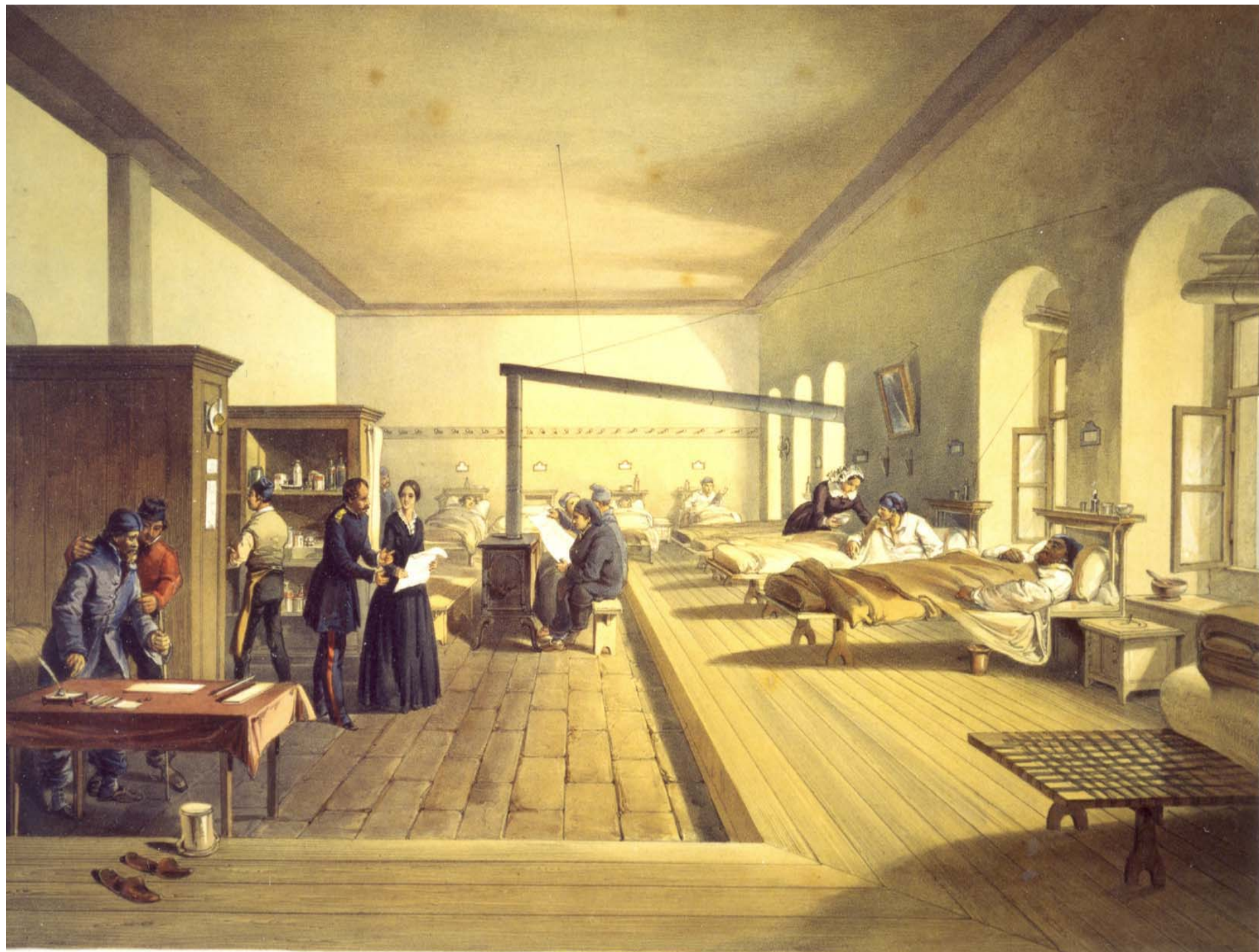

Emergency Medicine is a specialty based on the knowledge, skills & competencies for the prevention, assessment & management of acute & urgent aspects of illness & injury affecting patients of all age groups with a full spectrum of undifferentiated physical & behavioural disorders

Emergency Medicine further encompasses an understanding of the development of pre-hospital & in-hospital emergency medical systems & the skills necessary to participate in this development.

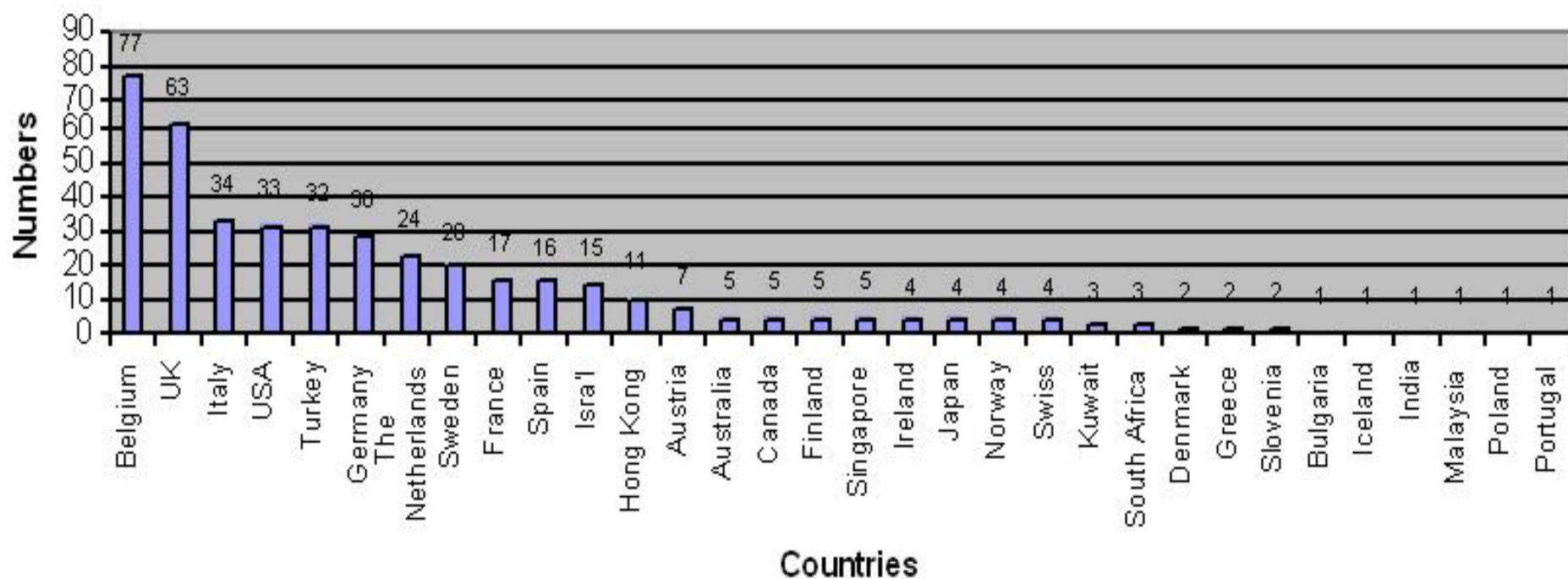

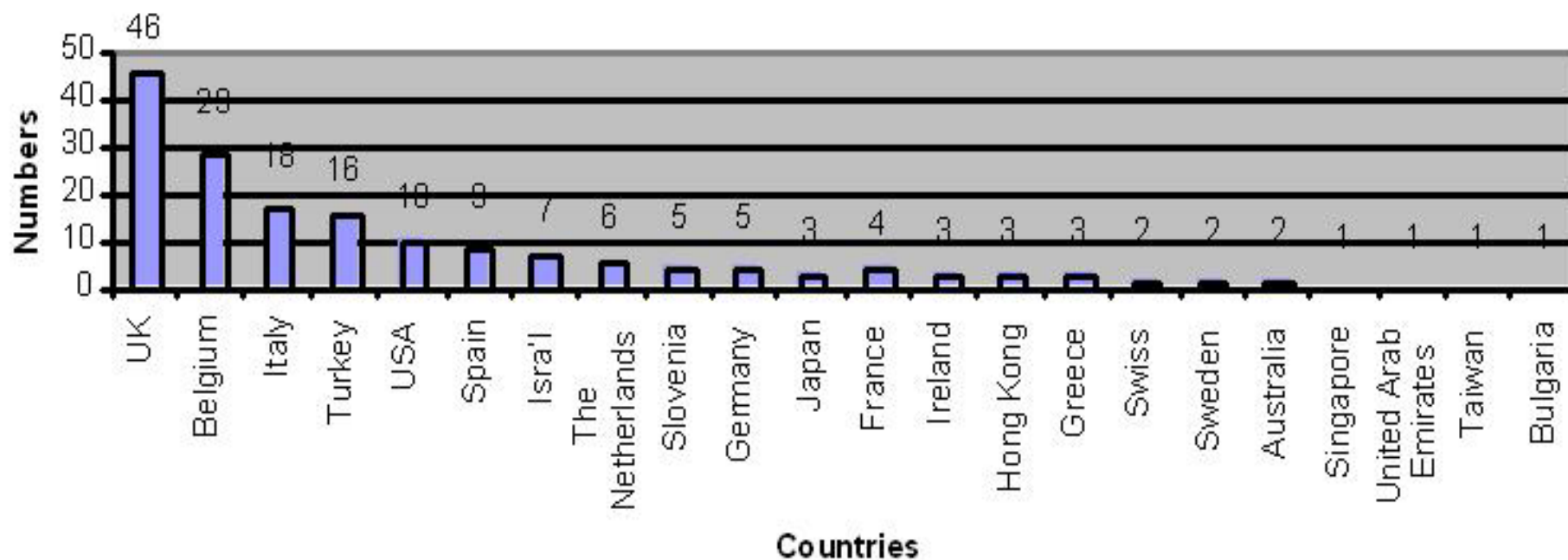

Emergency Medicine in Europe

- ◆ Formal recognition of specialties determined by EU Directive 93/16, now 2001/19/EC
- ◆ EM included in Directives from 1993
- ◆ Until 2004, Directives recognised EM as specialty only in UK and Ireland
- ◆ Since 2004, EM recognised as primary specialty also in Czech Republic, Hungary, Malta, Poland & Slovenia

Union Européenne des Médecins Spécialistes (UEMS)

- ◆ Statutory purpose of U.E.M.S. is the harmonisation and improvement of medical specialist practice in the European Union
- ◆ Key element is education and U.E.M.S. is seeking to formulate a common policy in the field of training

Multidisciplinary Joint Committee on EM

- ◆ First meeting in Brussels 28 April 2005
- ◆ Sections of Anaesthesia, Internal Medicine, Geriatric Medicine, Allergy..... and EuSEM
- ◆ Sections of Surgery, Paediatrics and Neurology also invited
- ◆ Working towards harmonisation of Teaching, Training and Practice of EM
- ◆ Reviewing EM Curriculum and Competencies



Principles of Training in Europe (Recommendations of EuSEM)

- ◆ 5 year programme of specialist training
- ◆ Minimum of 3 years in Emergency Department
- ◆ Training Departments and Trainers to be accredited by a National Training Authority
- ◆ Annual Assessment of Trainees
- ◆ Final Formal Evaluation (format to be agreed)



EM Core Curriculum for Europe

- ◆ Core Competencies

e.g. Clinical Practice	Communication
Teaching	Management
Research	Pre-Hospital Care

- ◆ Problem-oriented Knowledge Base
